Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design or CPTED (pronounced *sep-ted*) suggests that the design of buildings, landscaping and outdoor environments can prevent crime and reduce illicit activity.

-  MURALS
-  FENCING/GATES
-  FACADE IMPROVEMENT/REPAIR
-  DEVELOPMENT INCENTIVES
-  LIGHTING

PROJECT GOALS

- Disincentivize negative and illicit activity
- Promote positive use of space
- Create opportunities to bring neighbors together
- Increase ownership of space and reporting
